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Enrichment Day 2024

Our final Enrichment Day of the year involved a range of motivating and engaging activities. These days support the PSHE and Careers curriculum as well as offering our students the opportunity to acquire new knowledge and understanding to help broaden horizons and strengthen character.

Year 7-10

Our students were involved in a range of sessions focusing on teamwork, careers, mental health, Science and Computer Science.

Careers:







Friends of Becket Keys, our Governors, parents, teachers and our the wider school community supported our Careers Fair. Over 30 employers spent time talking to each of our students about their jobs, the opportunities in their sector, qualifications and training needed. They also provided an opportunity for the students to ask questions, which they did with interest, enthusiasm and maturity. Many of our visitors expressed how well students represented our school. The experience of being able to hear from a range of employers and career pathways was motivating, engaging, and inspiring.

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Online Safety/Mental Health:

In this session students met a singer and songwriter, DRCY. Computer Science:

Creativity, organisation, and evaluation skills were at the forefront of these sessions. Mrs Pogoda organised an IT session based on exploration of key skills involved in the IT world. Students explored a range of Career pathways that are available using innovative technology.

The Year 7s completed an experiment based on purifying water during a zombie apocalypse! And the Year 10s completed practicals in preparation for their exams. Sessions were interactive and exciting for all.



Free School Meal Vouchers

Summer Holiday

Further funding for Free School Meal vouchers for the Summer break 2024 has been allocated by the Local Authority. As with previous holidays, the school will be using the school voucher system, Wonde, to issue vouchers.

The local authority has confirmed this is the only voucher that you will be able to order. There is unfortunately no more funding after this point.

Parents and carers of eligible children will have received an email from Wonde to allow you to claim a voucher for £75 for this period. Please check your junk mail if you have not received this. The email will contain a link to "redeem a voucher". You will be taken to Wonde's "evouchers" page (previously named Schoolvouchers), where you will need to enter your details and confirm your email address before being asked to select the retailer you wish to receive a voucher for.

The current retailers available are Asda, Aldi, Farmfoods, M&S, Iceland, Morrisons, Sainsburys, Waitrose and Tesco. You will then be given a PIN and the option to view the voucher. Having confirmed the PIN, you will be issued your voucher. The voucher barcode can be printed off or scanned ion a smartphone for use in-store.
