## Mrs Sharp writes.....

A long time ago, people across the globe lived by the rhythm of the seasons, the waxing and waning of the moon, and the ebb and flow of the tides. They felt awe watching a beautiful sunset, fear and trembling in the face of a storm, and gratitude for the bounty of the harvest. They built their religions around those core experiences that guaranteed their survival. Over time, and very gradually, things changed. Humanity evolved from nomadic hunter/gatherers to landed agrarians to an industrial and then to a post-industrial economy. Perhaps, in many ways, we have lost some of the deep and instinctual wisdom of our ancestors, but as we stand on the threshold of autumn, we have the chance to reflect on the biblical themes of harvest and gratitude.

In the Bible, God is often depicted as a provider and sustainer, giving thanks for the blessings of the earth (Psalm 65:5-13). Autumn's harvest season can be seen as a time of thanksgiving for the fruits of our labour and a reminder of God's provision. It is a chance to renew our connections to God, others and nature.

If seen as part of the whole four seasons of the year, autumn also becomes a time of preparing for new beginnings. Clearing the garden and planting the bulbs which will stay buried deep in the ground all through winter but will burst through and blossom in the spring. At school, the Autumn Term is all about new beginnings, with fresh new exercise books, learning opportunities and chances to grow in faith and character; all of which add



## What is Chinese Bridge Competition?

Chinese Bridge Competition is an international speaking competition for learners of Mandarin Chinese. It has two big categories – the Primary Category for students between 5 to 12 years old, organised by Centre for Language Education and Cooperation and the Secondary Category for secondary Mandarin students, organised by British Council.



Last Friday, 20<sup>th</sup> September, Becket Keys MEP students went



to an Award Ceremony, hosted in the International Students House. This event was attended by contestants in the UK who have won either the individual or the group competition, as well as their coaching teachers. The special guests who granted the awards were the Director of Confucius Institute – Katharine Carruthers, Minister Counsellor for Education, Chinese Embassy – Zhang Jin, as well as executive representatives from both British Council and Department for Education.



The event involved highlight reels from the competitions, the award ceremony and a Chinese

traditional art performance. The organisers kindly provided snacks, lunch, and drink.



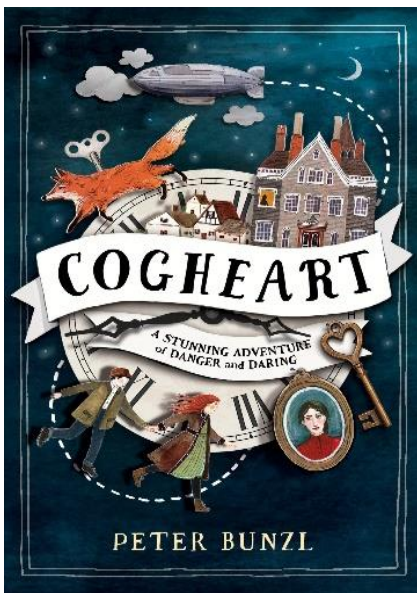
All participants thoroughly enjoyed the day. We very much look forward to the fifth annual Chinese Bridge Competitions this academic year.

### Year 7

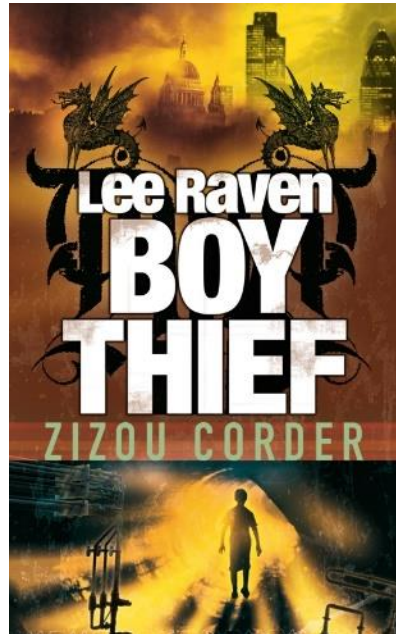

Lee Raven, boy thief, has stolen something he really didn't mean to.

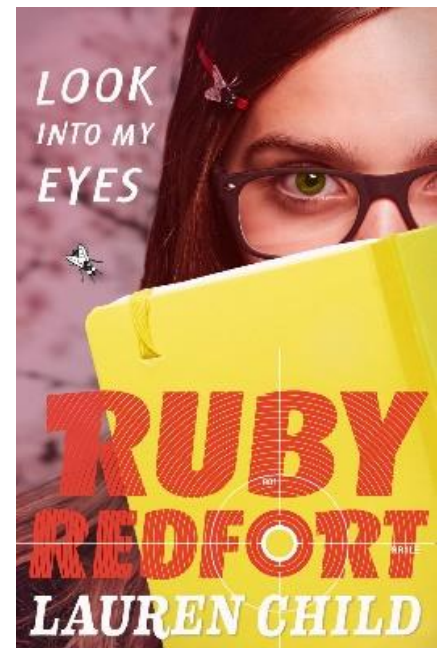

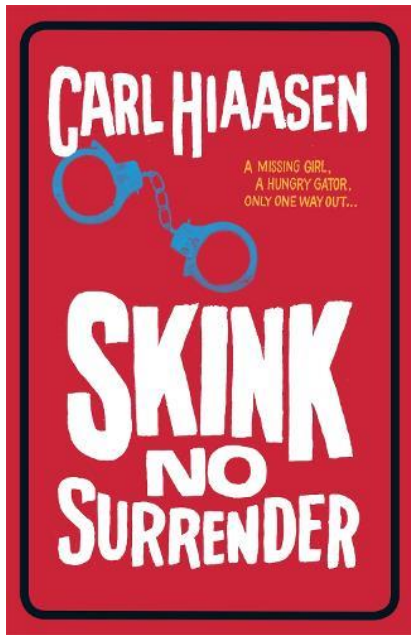

### Skink No Surrender Carl Hiaasen



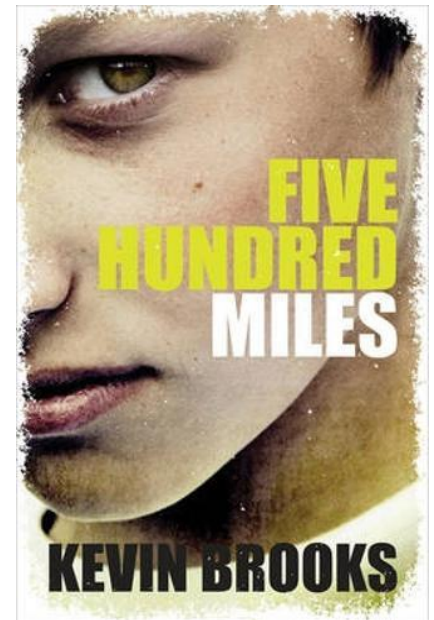
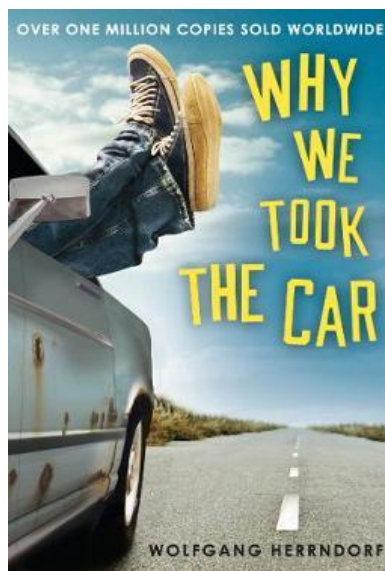

### Five Hundred Miles Kevin Brooks

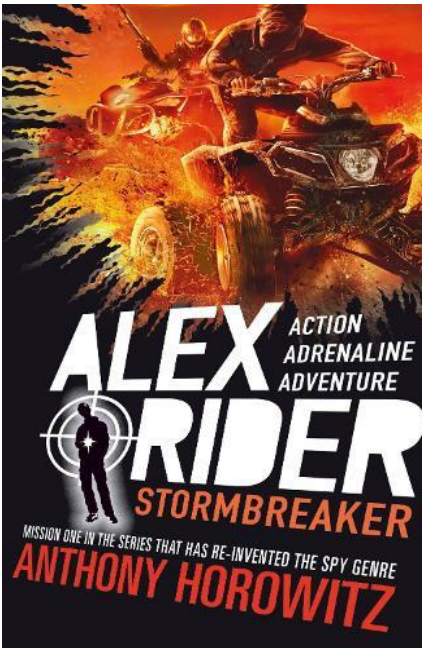
